



BOOK REVIEW: TWO-WAY MURDER BY E.C.R. LORAC

This is a classic Whodunit in a classic setting: a quiet English village, filled with all manner of people (and a manor house as well), is rocked by a body found on a road after the annual Hunts Ball at Fordings. The main investigator has new-fangled ways of approaching murders in small towns, as he talks to everyone and tries to capture local gossip, which always reveals more than people think it does. As Detective Waring

chats away, he discovers long-standing feuds, a caravan of gypsies, and several bachelors vying for the hands of several bachelorettes, with several upstart servants helping out as well.

Best of all, the murder itself was hard to figure out, and it was logical. In fact, a more careful reader than me might have been able to solve it very early on in the story, and then watch with anticipation as the detective maneuvers the murderer into confessing in the closing pages of the book. Just a wonderful period piece, perfect for fans of Agatha Christie.
